#### Facilitate high quality teacher development

We plan to organise and host a professional development conference for teachers in the region, facilitating access to first-rate speakers and classroom practitioners.

Our aim is to promote continuing excellence in teaching and learning across the North East.

#### Transform individuals' lives through bursaries

Together, we can make a significant impact on large numbers of young people - with your help we will employ and manage teachers whose timetables include work at state schools with a need for support.

To achieve this we plan to expand our clay workshop programme and visit over 30 schools and classrooms, before June 2026.
