# Welcome...

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Since Yarm School's foundation in 1978 it has become the major educational success story in the North East. Our academic results and facilities are outstanding, but the School offers much more than an excellent academic education: we firmly believe in educating for life.

As well as offering pupils the opportunity to reach their academic potential and achieve excellent results in public examinations, we aim to nurture and encourage values that ensure our pupils become adults who will contribute positively to society. We help them develop the attributes and skills sought by employers so that they are equipped for life beyond school. It is important to us that these skills are honed within a caring, friendly and mutually supportive community and our pastoral care ensures that pupils are known as individuals and supported at each step of their journey through the School.

There are a multitude of opportunities to be involved in musical ensembles, groups and performances, from atmospheric shows in smaller venues to major orchestral and choral concerts. House Drama competitions give large numbers of pupils the opportunity to tread the boards, and our whole school productions are typically of exceptional quality, playing to large audiences in the Princess Alexandra Auditorium.



# Admissions

# **Nursery**

Children are welcomed into Yarm School Nursery from the term before they turn 3 years old. No formal assessment of children entering Nursery is undertaken, although parents will be asked about their child's general development and any identified special needs prior to a place being offered. Places are not automatic; in some rare cases a place will not be offered if we judge that a child's development is below the parameters of the Early Learning Goals or that they will not flourish in this environment. All children will be expected to meet our entry requirements for transfer to Reception.

### Pre-Prep

Children joining the School at 4+, 5+ and 6+ undertake an informal assessment before a place is offered. For children joining Reception, this takes the form of an age-appropriate nursery book-based assessment, plus simple activities to assess fine motor skills and other basic abilities. For children joining Year 1 and Year 2, the assessment requires that children show a little of their achievements in reading, writing and mathematics. This will take the form of a standardised test. Reports and references will be taken from current schools. Children entering during Year 2 will be required to carry out standardised tests in reading, mathematics and nonverbal reasoning. Assessments are made to identify potential and a willingness to engage in the tasks, rather than mere academic prowess. We understand that children come to us with differing pre-school and school experiences, and at

varying stages of development. All children will be expected to meet our entry requirements for transfer from Year 2 to Year 3.

# Prep

Children wishing to join the School in Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6) undertake written assessments in reading, mathematics and non-verbal reasoning. These are standardised NfER papers, which are age related. Scores of 108 and above are generally required for entry into the School although reports from current schools, behaviour, previous learning experiences and special needs are also taken into account. The assessments are taken in the morning, following which the candidate spends the remainder of the School day with their peer group.

### Entry into Year 7 (11+)

Children entering the Senior School at 11+ will be required to sit a Transfer Assessment or Entrance Assessment. This is normally taken in January prior to the September entry. There will be a number of paper-based assessments, designed to measure a child's ability in maths, reading, spelling and extended writing. These are all designed to be accessible to all Year 6 pupils from all schools. Typically, we are looking to accept candidates who are working beyond national age-related expectations. More information will be sent out to all registered candidates before Christmas. The Headmaster will also request a reference from the applicant's current school and offers of places are dependent upon good behaviour.

Any prospective candidates who apply after the January Entrance Assessments have taken place may sit the test by appointment and, if successful, will be offered a place if available or a place on the waiting list if the year group is fully subscribed.

# **Entry into Sixth Form**

In order to secure entry to the Sixth Form all pupils (existing Yarm School pupils and external applicants) must meet our General Requirement and the Specific Requirements for the subjects they wish to pursue at A Level (please see the Sixth Form Prospectus for more details). Those who wish to do so are required to apply for a place whilst in Year 11 using the Application Form. All applicants will be invited to a personal consultation with The Headmaster and Head of Sixth Form. Applicants will be asked to bring along a sample of GCSE work in subjects relevant to their chosen A Level subjects and a recent school report or Record of Achievement. A written reference will also be requested from the applicant's present school.

Appointments for consultations can be made after the Open Morning and consultations commence from early November onwards. Places will be offered after consultations have taken place, around mid-February. Consultations are arranged at a mutually convenient time (after school). If a place in the Sixth Form is offered then this is conditional on meeting the GCSE performance requirements.





# Scholarships and Bursaries

Yarm School is keen to attract pupils of considerable potential who will make the most of the opportunities on offer. The School offers both Scholarships and Bursaries.

# Bursaries (Senior and Sixth Form pupils)

Yarm School wishes to make it possible for bright, promising children to be able to attend the School regardless of their financial or domestic circumstances. Meanstested bursaries are available for bright children joining the First Year (Year 7) or Lower Sixth (Year 12) in our Sixth Form.

A Bursary is a fee reduction to take account of limited parental resources, funded from deposits set aside for this purpose and from the general income of the School. As a guide, assistance is given on a sliding scale, linked to family income. The School will consider making an award where the total gross family income is less than £55,000 per annum. In some cases the School will also offer financial support for extras such as lunch, trips and uniform.

All applications are dealt with on the understanding that enquiry will be made as a matter of routine into the financial resources (including assets) of any family making a Bursary application. All details made in the application are kept confidential. Bursaries are always offered for 12 months at a time. The family is required to provide fresh information about their circumstances for every year that their child attends the School.

Parents wishing to understand more about Bursaries should refer to the School's Bursary Policy, a copy of which is available on our website or by request via Mrs Herbert (head@ yarmschool.org). A Bursary application form is available and applications must be submitted to the School as soon as possible and before Wednesday, 11th December 2024 at the latest. Bursary applications which are received later than this are unlikely to be successful as the funds are likely to have been allocated. It is likely that there will be more Bursary applications than there are funds available therefore not all applications will be successful.

# Music Scholarships (Entry at: 11+, 13+ or 16+)

Pupils at 11+, 13+ or 16+ may apply for a Music Scholarship. Candidates for these awards must, in the first instance, show reasonable all-round academic ability in the Entrance Assessment. A high standard of achievement for the age of the pupil is expected on one or more instruments or voice; candidates may also offer composition at 16+.

A separate Music Audition is given to candidates. Retention of such an award is subject to excellent musical progress and a high level of involvement in the musical life of the School; in addition, the pupil must make sound academic progress and display high standards of behaviour. Applications must be received as soon as possible, no later than Wednesday, 11th December 2024.

# Sixth Form Scholarships

Yarm School is pleased to offer up to four Sixth Form scholarships annually of up to 100% off tuition fees for outstanding candidates new to the School. These are meanstested awards and joint parental income must be below £45,000 p.a. The aim of these scholarships is to promote the benefits of an independent school Sixth Form education to those who would not otherwise be able to afford private education.

Four Fully Funded Sixth **Form Places** 

Four fully funded Sixth Form places may be awarded to outstanding applicants new to the School. Candidates must secure a minimum of eight 7/8/9 grades at GCSE.

Application forms are available from the School and must be submitted by Wednesday, 11th December 2024 along with the Supplementary Information Form and a copy of a recent school report. We will then request a reference from the student's current school.

Candidates for scholarships will be required to sit a special assessment in the subjects to be studied at A Level on the morning of Saturday, 18th January 2025. The performance in these assessments, and information from school reports and references will be used to shortlist applicants who will then be called to an interview with the Headmaster and Head of Sixth Form.

Fees naturally tend to increase in line with teaching costs and general inflation and it is the School's policy to cover these increased costs by means of annual changes to the fee levels.

VAT implication: The base fees for the Spring and Summer terms 2025 have been reduced by the School, prior to adding the VAT, to mitigate the cost impact. Looking ahead to the 2025/26 academic year and beyond, the Governors are hopeful that further support will be available to phase the impact of VAT to families.



# **Exam Results 2024**

Yarm School celebrated eclipsing regional and national averages, and breaking school examination records in 2024. This year's results have yet again, positioned Yarm as the leading academic school in the area.

We are extremely proud of all of our pupils and students and wish them the very best for their bright futures.

### **A Level Results**

With strong results across the board, 30% of students achieved three or more A\*-A grades with nine students securing three or more of the very highest A\* grades.

The extraordinary nine students accumulated 32 A\* grades between them. These students have not only excelled academically but have also fully embraced the

wide range of extra-curricular opportunities on offer at Yarm.

One student was recognised as one of the highest performers in the country in her English Literature examinations.

Alongside the traditional A level subjects, students can also complete an Extended Project Qualification which is highly regarded by universities. At Yarm, the majority of students choose to carry out an independent project to obtain the qualification and in 2024 61% achieved A\*/A grades. Three students achieved full marks.

Students secured places at a wide range of highly competitive courses and destinations, with six students achieving places at Oxford or Cambridge Universities this year. They will be heading to study a wide range

of subjects: engineering, medicine, classics, chemistry and German.

Popular courses for Yarm students include Engineering with over 18% of the cohort going on to read an engineering degree. Medicine and Business courses remain popular choices with more students opting to study Psychology this year.

Newcastle University has been popular this year with eighteen students choosing to study there and remain in the North East, other popular destinations include Durham, York and Nottingham. One pupil is heading further afield to the USA to study at Brigham Young University.







### **GCSE Results**

Yarm School is celebrating its best ever GCSE examination results with 54% of all grades awarded being the top 9-8 grades (A\*), with a third of all grades at grade 9.

Yarm surpassed the national average number of grade 9s by more than 6 times. Yarm pupils got more than four times the national average for grades 9-8. The national average was 12.1% compared to our 54% of grades 9-8 (A\*). In the North East 17.8% of all GCSE grades were a 7 or higher compared to Yarm's 75% again more than four times higher.

More than 21% of the cohort (27 pupils) gained a straight set of 9/8 grades with 15 pupils achieving the impressive feat of 10 or more grade 9s. One pupil was recognised as one of the top performers in the country in his OCR Computer Science exam.

Our pupils broke Yarm's GCSE records by beating the top grades achieved in examinations in previous years but have also performed impressively outside the classroom. The 2024 GCSE cohort has also excelled in a wide range of extracurricular activities, showcasing their talents on national stages in sports, music, and drama.

These outstanding results reflect the determination and ambition of our pupils. Furthermore, they are also a strong affirmation of the quality of teaching and support given to pupils at Yarm.

We encourage every pupil to be the best they can be, only only in the classroom, but on the stage, sports field or in the varied clubs and activities on offer at the School. Pupils at Yarm balance both academic and extracurricular success at Yarm and help pupils develop 'soft' skills that are not only highly sought after by universities and employers, but prepare our pupils for challenges beyond school. Encapsulating the School's ethos 'Educating for Life.

Within these impressive results are a range of individual success stories that reflect personal endeavour, exceeding their own expectations and aspirations. We celebrate the success of these terrific year groups who have contributed a huge amount to the wider life of the school.



# Location

Yarm School is easily accessible by road and public transport. Visitors can use online mapping and Sat Nav directions by inputting the School postcode: TS15 9EJ (Senior School) or TS15 9ES (Preparatory School).

# By car

From the South: take the slip road off the A1 at Dishforth to the A168/ A19 Northbound. From the A19, exit onto the A67 signposted 'Yarm'. Follow the road for 2 miles until you reach a roundabout with a Shell petrol garage. Go straight across onto The Spital towards Yarm High Street. The Nursery,

Pre-Prep, and Prep School are on the left opposite the Senior School exit. The Senior School entrance is on the right after the corner.

From the North: using either the A19 South or the A1 South, from both roads, follow signs for the A66, Stockton and Darlington or Teesside. Follow the A66 to the junction signposted 'A135 Stockton & Yarm'. From here follow the signs for 'A135-Yarm' and continue on this road directly into Yarm. An entrance to the Senior School is on the left hand side at the end of the High Street, after the Church. The Nursery and Pre-Prep, and Prep School are further along the Spital on the left hand side.

Parking: Visitor parking at the Prep School and Senior School is available. The Senior School visitor parking is onsite. Please sign in at the Senior School Reception. The Nursery, Pre-Prep and Prep School parking is just before (from South) or just after (from North) the Pre-Prep building.

# By train

The principal station is at Darlington. There are frequent links to both Eaglescliffe and Yarm Stations. Both are a fifteen/twenty minute walk from the School. Station Taxis operate from Eaglescliffe Station.
